1. DESIRED RESULTS

Essential Questions

Knowledge and Skills

1. Which careers fit best with my assessed skills, interests and values?
2. Which colleges best match my preferences and would most help me achieve my career goals?
3. Which college majors should I pursue to attain my career goals?
4. How can I find jobs in my local area that match my career interests?
5. How can I effectively create a resume to apply for the jobs that I find?
6. What steps should I be taking now to prepare for college and my future career?

Students will know:

1. A career cluster based on assessed skills, interests and values
2. At least 25 careers that best match students' assessed skills, interests and values (that will range from those requiring a high school diploma to 4 year degrees and higher)
3. At least 10 colleges that best fit student preferences.
4. At least 10 college majors that would be best for students to major in to achieve their desired career goals.
5. How to effectively create a resume to use for print and online applications.
6. What steps they should be taking now to better prepare for their college and careers.

Students will do:

1. Create a profile with www.virginiawizard.org
2. Complete three assessments to discover skills, interests and values.
3. Complete research on careers based on students' assessed skills, interests and values.
4. Complete research on colleges and college majors that best fit students' chosen careers.
5. Complete the online resume wizard and save both a Word and .pdf file of their resume for print and online applications.
6. Complete the preparation for college section of the website and determine what steps to be taking now to be better prepared.
7. Prepare a PowerPoint that encompasses all of the research completed above.
8. Present the PowerPoint to the class.
9. Critique other students' PowerPoints as they are presented.
10. Continue using Virginia Wizard for future college and career needs.

2. STUDENT ASSESSMENT

Prior knowledge

Ongoing throughout lesson

By the end of the lesson

Students will have a prior knowledge of basic Internet searching techniques. They will also be referencing prior journal entries based on career ambitions and college preferences.

Students will be completing worksheets to help them research careers and college choices. They will also be creating a resume using the Virginia Wizard resume creation section.

Students will make a final presentation to the entire class of their research. They will also be using peer review techniques to critique other presentations.

Students will create and present a PowerPoint presentation based on all of their acquired research. 2. Students will critique other presentations. 3. <p>Extra support: Individual attention will be paid to those students who need special accommodations. The special education teacher will be provided a copy of the lesson plan to allow for accommodations to be made for those students with Individualized Education Plans.</p> <p>Enrichment or early finishers: Early finishers can use extra time to research more specific details about their chosen careers or colleges. Students will be encouraged to begin contacting colleges and searching for scholarships and financial aid.</p> <p>Various learning styles: The teacher will provide a variety of teaching materials including written instructions along with verbal instructions. A rubric and timeline will be provided for those students needing more structure and individual assistance will be provided to those students who need hands-on instruction.</p> <p>Limited English proficiency: Translation web sites and dictionaries may be used to assist these students.</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1.
